






One attribute of chemotherapy in the adjuvant setting is prescription of full doses, particularly with the first cycle.



Another attribute of chemotherapy in the adjuvant setting is the use of standard (guideline-concordant) chemotherapy regimens.











- Collaborative of medical and gyn oncologists
